Pathways towards Inclusion -

Transitions from Sheltered Employment for People with Intellectual Disabilities into the Regular Labour Market: Identification, Dissemination and Implementation of Good Practice in Europe

To support compliance with the EU and UN inclusion goals, in 2021 the European Parliament formulated a call for more research in the field of sheltered workshops. Include³ responds to this call and will develop resources and a curriculum in an inclusive and co-productive research process to create individualized pathways for people with intellectual disabilities from targeted vocational training and general education towards sustainable employment and dignified work. Based on a curriculum for the Include³ method, vocational counsellors working in or for sheltered workshops will conduct seminars with people with intellectual disabilities, employers, and the vocational education specialists.

By piloting and evaluating the seminars, it will be ensured that the method can be sustainably established in various European countries. Include³ will thus lead to the development of a process to align sheltered vocational training with the individual needs, abilities and aspirations of people with intellectual disabilities and with labour market opportunities. Curriculum and resources available through a fully accessible web portal will ensure the applicability and dissemination of this process so that sheltered vocational workshops can better contribute to the goal of labour market inclusion. The goal is to personalize vocational training to achieve close adaptation to the needs of the labour market.

The project is co-funded by the European Union through the Erasmus+ funding program for a period of three years (01/09/2022- 31/08/2025). University of Applied Labour Studies of the Federal Employment Agency (HdBA) is the project leading organisation. Partners are the Service and Disability Company Ozara (Maribor, Slovenia), Synthesis Center for Research and Education, (Nicosia, Cyprus), the VHS Educational Institute VoG (Eupen, Belgium) and eMundus (Kaunas, Lithuania).
